Volunteers Serve in Vital Areas

Vital ministry areas at Green Lake Conference Center are served by faithful volunteers!

Although summer is our busiest season, we need volunteers in spring and fall as well. We seek volunteer applicants who:

- Desire to serve in a Christian environment supporting the mission of Green Lake by enhancing programs and conferences, showing hospitality for guests, and assisting in practical operation support.
- Possess skills, interests and experience in specific areas of need.
- Are in good physical health to carry out normal and routine tasks; physical stamina is required in many positions.
- Have sufficient financial resources to volunteer a significant portion of time, maintain personal needs, and carry adequate medical and hospitalization insurance.
- Are able and willing to work approximately 20 hours per week.

Volunteers may be rotated in and out of the program in order to allow more people to share in this meaningful experience.

Our Volunteers Work

Areas of service:

Troster Art Studios (art teaching and learning center): ceramics, lapidary, jewelry making, china decorating and stained glass (we will train)

Country Store (camping supplies and treats): basic retail experience helpful

Worldwide Gifts (gift store that shares proceeds with mission projects around the world): basic retail experience helpful

Food Service: dining room & kitchen

Campground/Host

Greenhouse, grounds and flowers

Maintenance: general/hotel/lodge

Housekeeping and Laundry

Volunteers are asked to serve in time blocks of two weeks (minimum) up to six to a full season from Memorial Day to Labor Day. Volunteers choose how many weeks they are available to serve:

Spring: March - Memorial Day Weekend

Summer: May 15-July 30 Late: Aug. 1-Sept. 6

Fall: Sept. 7- Thanksgiving

Housing

A limited number of rooms are available for volunteers who do not live locally.

If needed, we ask volunteers to consider alternative dates of service to rotate the housing that is available.





Many volunteers own trailers in our seasonal campgrounds and receive 25% off their annual camping fee when serving full time.

Volunteer housing is one to two miles away on the grounds, so volunteers need to have their own transportation.

Travel is at the volunteer's expense and can be taken as a tax deduction.
